On Sunday a group of local and regional residents gathered around the Rosny Barn and local parks in opposition to Tasmania's proposed AFL High Performance center, which is set to be located in this area, specifically the former Rosny golf course site, and Charles Hand Park (Department of State Growth, 2024). The site is still undetermined as an official Heads of Agreement is yet to be passed by the Clarence City Council, and with a Mayor who opposes the placement of the center in the parks, it may slow down the state parliament and AFL.




UNEMPLOYM<mark>ent fel</mark>l to 4% in May

THURSDAY 13TH JUNE

New figures released from the ABS indicates the unemployment rate has fallen to 4% despite an increase in trend unemployment (seasonally adjusted unemployment), which picked up last month by 0.1%. (ABC, 2024). This is some good news for our economic situation as it seems the RBAs unemployment forecast were spot on (Tony Sycamore, 2024), and will have little impact on next week's RBA meeting. It also suggests that Australia's monetary policy is working, even if slower than what the RBA expected.

SUNDAY 16TH JUNE 2024 **MASSIVE CHANGES AT BONORONG** WILDLIFE SANCTUARY

there have been a lot of big changes at the Bonorong Wildlife sanctuary over the last 2 years. over the last few years Greg Irons (Owner) and his te<mark>am have</mark> been planning on expanding their operations by installing a dedicated wildlife hospital, and sea bird rehabilitation center, with a recovery pool. Part of the project(s) funding was through private donors, pa<mark>rticipants o</mark>f the WIIdride fundraiser event and direct res<mark>ource/mon</mark>etary donations from businesses.

This year the Wildride program raised over \$31,000 with the contributions of over 90 participants across the state and abroad. Last year another f<mark>undraiser c</mark>alled "Project RECAP" raised critical funds for the wildlife hospital, which is set to replace the curr<mark>ent one du</mark>e to a surging increase in demand. Major donors for Bonorong RECENT EVENTS include VersEseal, Bendigo Bank and the Pennicott Foundation and many more.

a couple weeks ago, local business called "Repair Cafe Hobart donated over \$1,500 to the park's director Greg Irons. the Fletchers (the family that runs repair cafe) have a long history of supporting bird rehabilitation, looking after many when Bonorong's wildlife hospital reached max capacity over the previous years, and they have been recognized as key local supporters of the Bonorong programs and the wildlife hospital.

as part of Bonorong's mission, individuals have also formed a separate "Friends of Bonorong" program which has so far raised over \$90,000 which directly supports the operational costs of critical care programs.

fortunately I got the opportunity to be apart of the Wild Ride program for 2024, and witness myself the fast changes happening at Bonorong. Myself and Thought Digest Media look forward to participate in some upcoming programs in July including "The Wild Night Out" in July.
